### **2023 and onwards activities:**

'BSA Sociology of Elites Study Group Founding Conference' – at the LSE on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2023

We hope to plan a one-day, in-person 'Training workshop on using multiple correspondence analysis to study elites' at the LSE.

We are planning an online panel event on 'Studying the relationality of inequality and power: linking the divide' in Feb 2024 co-hosted with the BSA Sociology of Class Study Group and the Elite Studies Working Group

We are planning a three-day, in-person workshop on 'Studying elite organisations, corporation and professional enablers: interdisciplinary research for social change' in June 2024 funded by the NCRM.

We are planning a two-day, in-person conference on 'Transnational elites in imperial contexts: global power and its contestation' in late 2023 or 2024

We are planning two informal seminars in autumn 2023 and spring 2024, on topics to be defined nearer the dates.
